1. History on 4 SEP systems: ~~1) 4 Capitalisms~~, 2) Christian socialism: ~~1st generation in Victorian England~~; **2nd generation of socialism in North America**; ~~3) Marxism (atheistic), 4) Atheistic socialism/communism.~~
 2. Economic idealism vs. economic reality: the history of ~~Britain (47%), France (57%), Germany (45%), Sweden (53%), European Union (1951-), Soviet Union (1917-1991), Soviet Bloc, East Germany, West Germany, China (45%), Asian Tigers (SK 40%, Singapore, Taiwan), and the United States (18th-20th).~~
 3. What the Word of God says about government: 10,000 principles.
 - a. The two systems: James 4:4-5:6 vs. Acts 2:42-44.
 - b. Old Testament: one nation.
 - c. New Testament: heavenly citizenship, de-nationalization.
